Registration:

New Students- All new students must complete an online application for admission to the College at www.sheridan.edu. Once admitted, students will receive information from Advising instructing them how to enroll in classes. Contact the Enrollment Services Office at (307) 675-0100 for more information.

Register for Classes- Register early, because many classes fill quickly. Contact the Enrollment Services Office at 307-675-0100 if you have questions or to schedule an advising appointment.

- Once admitted, all new degree-seeking students must meet with an advisor to select and register for the appropriate classes for degree completion.
- Current students may register online or in person at the Enrollment Services Office.
- Former students who have an active MyNWCCD account will need to contact Enrollment Services to reactivate their online registration.
- Former students that cannot access their MyNWCCD account have to reapply as a new degree or non-degree seeking student.

Transcripts- NWCCD utilizes National Student Clearinghouse for processing of all transcripts. To order your transcript to be mailed or delivered electronically, access the National Student Clearinghouse at <http://studentclearinghouse.org>. Click the orange Order-Track-Verify button and select Order or Track a Transcript. Select Northern Wyoming Community College District from the drop-down menu. The cost is \$10 per delivery address for mailed transcripts (limit 3 copies) and \$5 per email address for electronic transcripts. Requests must be made by the student! Please note: Transcripts will not be processed if a balance is on the account.

Directory Information- Under the terms of the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA), the College has established the following as directory information: name, address, e-mail, telephone number, program of study, campus, dates of attendance, degrees and awards, date and place of birth, previous schools attended, participation in officially recognized sports and activities, and weight and height of members of athletic teams. Students who want to block release of this information must contact the Enrollment Services Office at 307-675-0110.

Tuition and Fee Refunds

A portion of tuition and fees will be refunded to any student who officially withdraws from credit classes, as follows:

Students who drop courses but maintain their full-time status will only be refunded student, institutional, facility/technology, and course fees according to the above policy. Usage fees are not refundable after the first seven days. NO refunds will be made to students who do not officially drop or withdraw from classes, or whose misconduct has resulted in suspension or dismissal from the College.

Overload Fee - A tuition overload charge will be assessed for all hours in excess of 18 credit hours, in accordance with the student's residency classification. Overload charges are refundable based on our tuition refund policy.

Golden Age Grant - Wyoming residents who are 60 years of age or older qualify for tuition grants and reduced admission to special events. The Golden Age Grant will cover half the cost of tuition for credit courses (including audited courses). Golden Age Grants are not available for summer classes. These grants are awarded on a first-come, first-served basis and must be applied for each semester. An application form for this grant may be obtained from Enrollment Services Offices.

Paying Your College Bill - Charges for tuition and fees are made to your student account at the time of registration. It is your responsibility to take care of your college bill in one of the following ways:

- Pay your balance in full by the payment deadline of August 27, 2018, or
- Complete your 2018-2019 FAFSA application and any required verification to determine the total amount of your financial aid package. The FAFSA deadline is July 30, 2018, and must be completed by this deadline for federal financial aid to be considered as a payment source, or
- Sign up for a payment plan at MyNWCCD > Self Service for Students & Employees> Student Finance > Make a Payment OR <https://nwccd.afford.com> to cover any remaining balance.

If your balance is not paid in full, covered by financial aid or a payment plan by September 17, 2018 you will be charged a \$145 late payment fee. After the payment deadline of August 27, 2018, any new charges are due at registration. Students must immediately pay in full, sign up for a payment plan, or adjust an existing payment plan.

Payment Locations & Types - Payment types – cash, check, electronic check, cashier's check, certified check, money order, Visa, MasterCard, Discover, American Express

Account Fees

Insufficient Funds Fee - students will be charged a \$30 fee if their paper or electronic check payment is rejected due to insufficient funds.

Late Fee - if the student's account balance is not paid in full by September 17, 2018, a late fee of \$145 will be assessed to the account.
