NWCCD will send text and email notices on overdue accounts and other account activity, but will not mail paper statements.


I also understand that NWCCD uses my @sheridan.edu student email address as the primary method of communication from all offices and I promise to check my student email regularly.



What is Financial Aid?

Financial aid is money to help pay for college expenses and is available in a variety of sources. Examples of financial aid include:

- FAFSA: grants, student loans
- Scholarships: Sheridan College and/or private
- Private student loans: outside of FAFSA





Important Information:

- FAFSA Free Application Federal Student Aid
 - Must complete a FAFSA for each academic year!
- Types of Federal Aid
 - Pell Grant money you don't have to pay back!
 - Federal loans money you DO have to pay back!
- Grades Matter!
 - Satisfactory Academic Progress








How much do I owe? Self-Service: Student Finance

- Also called a credit balance.
- Gets paid to you as a refund!





What does a positive balance mean?

You owe the college



Acceptable Payment Methods

Online 24/7 via Nelnet – our Payment Processor accepts eChecks (ACH) or debit/credit card

In person – Cash, check, debit/credit card, money orders

Register to receive text services on your mobile phone.

Want to allow a friend or family member to pay toward your balance?

Add an Authorized Party.

- Flexible terms
 - No interest, one time enrollment fee of \$45 per semester (returned payments are charged \$30)
 - 5, 4, 3 and 2-month options; sign up by August 25 for the longest term
 - Automatic payment draws on the 1st or 15th of the month (bank payment for free or credit/debit card with fee)
- Exempts you from late fees
 - Set up by September 30 or pay any remaining semester balance to avoid late fees
- Payment plans must be <u>completed</u> by:
 - Fall 2023 January 15, 2024
 - Spring 2024 June 15, 2024
- Any payment plans not completed by the deadline are subject to a \$300 late fee

Federal & Private Loans

- Loans: money you DO have to pay back!
 - FAFSA (Federal)
 - Subsidized
 - Unsubsidized
 - Parent PLUS
 - Private

You are borrowing against your future paycheck!

Borrow only what you need!

Priority Deadline JULY 31, 2023

- File your 2023/2024 FAFSA and complete verification (if applicable) by this date
- This allows time for the Financial Aid Office to process aid and get it applied to your semester balance by the start of the fall semester
- Some grants/scholarships are awarded on a first-come, first serve basis

FERPA: Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974

- Once a student registers for college classes, your student account is YOURS
- ➤ A signed FERPA release is required to discuss anything about your record with anyone other than YOU:
 - Student account details
 - Financial aid
 - Balance due
 - FERPA can be completed at any time
 - Can NOT release grades!
